- The programme will provide the student with the necessary scientific knowledge, clinical practice and interpersonal skills. The programme will also socialise the student into the profession so that he/she demonstrates the appropriate attitude,

behaviour and image of the profession and uphold the ethical and legal codes that govern professional practice.

 On completion of the programme, the student will be able to register with the South African Nursing Council (SANC), as a Staff Nurse and will be able to enroll in further higher education studies in nursing.

Target Group:

Access to the programme is open, conditional to the admission requirements and the students' access to the facilities that will enable both theoretical and clinical learning to take place under recognized supervision.
