FACT SHEET | STUDYING NURSING IN SOUTH AFRICA

In South Africa, nursing is regulated by the SA Nursing Council (SANC).

- Applications for nurse education and training should be submitted to a SANC accredited education institution.

Qualifications

Following recent regulatory changes, undergraduate nursing training supports three professional designation categories:

- Registered auxiliary nurse. You can study at a SANC accredited private or public nursing education institution.
- Registered general nurse. You can study at a SANC accredited private or public nursing education institution.
- Registered professional nurse and midwife. The predominant route for the registered professional nurse and midwife is a bachelor's degree in nursing from a South African university.
